Entries and payments online on BROE only. Limit of 130 per division.

Entries will open at 6.00pm on Sun 12 Jan 25 and close at 7.00pm on Thu 30 Jan 25; all placeholder places must be filled and all entry fees must be paid close of entries.

Race fee per seat: £12 seniors & masters, £10 juniors, all coxes free.

- Clubs entering crews should be confident of their experience, competence and ability to steer and row in a competitive race in possibly challenging conditions. This applies particularly to all junior crews, coxless fours/quads and pairs/doubles. All competitors must be J14 or older.
- Crews in all Senior and Junior events may be banded based on CRIs if numbers allow. Clubs are required to tell us at the time of entry if crews are in their view under-pointed and should row in a higher band than the CRI suggests.
- Crews in Masters events may be raced in amalgamated age groups. Should it be in the interests of providing competitive races between crews of similar ability, banding may be used across Masters age groups. British Rowing handicaps will always be used, with or without banding.
- The riverbanks are open to the public, and the Organising Committee is unable to prevent photography. Competitors should be made aware of this by their clubs when entries are made.

Run under British Rowing *Rules of Racing* and in accordance with *RowSafe*.

NOTES

LIMIT ON NUMBER OF CREWS: The maximum number of boats in each division for safety reasons will be 130. This limit will be enforced whether or not more than 130 entries have been made. Crews with placeholders at the close of entries will not proceed to the draw.

ENTRY FEES: Entry fees must be paid by close of entries at 7.00pm on Thu 30 Jan 25. Any refunds for scratched crews after the close is solely at Tyne ARC's discretion. The start order will be published by Tue 4 Feb 25. In the event of partial/total cancellation due to weather or other circumstances beyond its control, Tyne ARC will make a refund, but retain a proportion of race fees so as to cover its unavoidable costs.

NUMBERS: Plastic Empacher slot numbers will be issued. Boats should be equipped with the appropriate slot. We will also issue paper number for bow rowers. Numbers will be issued and coxes weighed at Tyne ARC. Please return the plastic numbers afterwards.

PRIZES, BANDING & UPGRADING: There will be prizes in events (including Masters combined age groups) with three or more entries in the final draw and at least two starting. Depending on numbers we may band any event based on Crew Ranking Index. We reserve the right to say that Junior crews will 'row up' or, for Masters, to row in a combined age group so as to have a minimum in every event of three crews. We may reject any crew not having at least two opponents (although we will always seek a solution to this first).

WEATHER CONDITIONS: When making entries, clubs must satisfy themselves that all crews, but especially juniors and relative beginners, will be capable of coping with conditions that might be expected in February a large tidal river. On the day all crew members must take with them clothing suitable not only for rowing but also for waiting for some time at the start. Marshals may require crews to return to the steps at any time after boating if it appears that they are not capable of managing the conditions or do not have adequate clothing.

RACE SCHEDULE: To allow adequate time for the gap between divisions we must stick to the published boating and start times if at all possible. Boating locations and times will be shown on the final start order. Crews not ready to boat at the scheduled time may receive a time penalty or be prevented from boating if too late to reach the start area on schedule. Coxes will be weighed at Tyne ARC - your wrist band may be inspected on boating.

ALTERATIONS: Tyne ARC reserves the right to make any alterations to these arrangements and instructions which it deems necessary for the safe and efficient running of the competition.

LOCAL RULES: Please see the *Instructions to Clubs and Crews* (when ready) for Local Rules.

PERSONAL INSURANCE: Please note that the British Rowing individual membership insurance is only valid for UK residents who are resident in the country for more than six months in a year.
