The prize giving will be at Tyne ARC after the last division.

Entries open at 6.00pm on Mon 2 Mar 2026 and close at 6.00pm on Wed 18 Mar 2026.
There will be a limit of 60 entries in each division for safety reasons.

Race fees: £11.00 per seat, excluding coxes, payable
by close of entries. Entries via BROE only.

Events will be run on the basis of the age groups as above.
Banding might be used within an age group, if a large entry.

Notes - please read carefully before making entries

- 1 Entry is by the BROE online entry system only. Entries will open at 6.00pm on Mon 2 March 2026 and close at 6.00pm on Wed 18 March 2026. Race fees will be £11.00 per seat excluding coxes.
- 2 All payments must be made online on BROE and received by the close of entries. Placeholder gaps must also be filled by the close of entries.
- 3 The start order will be drawn up by Tue 24 March 2026.
- 4 The start order will be e-mailed out to all clubs who have submitted entries as soon as possible after it has been compiled. The same information will be posted on the Tyne ARC website together with other documents, including the *Instructions to Clubs and Crews*, which will incorporate local rules and possible penalties for infringement, notably about use of the correct arch at Newburn Bridge.
- 5 Prizes will be awarded in all categories with at least two entered *and* racing.
- 6 Where there are insufficient entries in your category at the close of entries, you will be entered in the next highest junior age category unless you state otherwise with your entry, e.g. giving an alternative event rather than rowing up. We will try to consult you as necessary on this before issuing the start order. In events where the number of entries allow, we may band entries on the basis of CRIs.
- 7 All events must be rowed within the divisions specified on the poster to qualify for a prize; crews wishing to row in a specific class but in a different division may do so for 'time only' but will still be liable for the full entry fee and must be entered on BROE (talk to us first, though).
- 8 The event organisers reserve the right to cancel individual boat classes, divisions or the whole event beforehand or on the day if weather and/or river conditions dictate. In the case of total cancellation, we will refund all entry fees less an allowance for unavoidable expenses. For a partial cancellation of classes and/or divisions on the day, refunds will be made for the cancelled events only, less the allowance for unavoidable expenses.
- 9 Coaches are reminded that they have an extra duty of care to junior crews and should consider *before* entering a crew whether the members are capable of handling potentially choppy conditions and/or strong stream that can occur on the Tyne. Tides will be relatively small and tidal flows in themselves will not be very strong: LT 2.06m at 6.10am, HT 4.10m at 12.10pm, LT 1.36m at 6.50pm.
- 10 Doubling or tripling up *between* divisions is positively encouraged (this includes competitors, coxes, boats and blades), but note that the event organisers cannot guarantee to provide a minimum rest interval between divisions, depending on size of entry.
- 11 All events will be in fine boats, which must be provided by the competitors and/or clubs.
- 12 There will be a Victor Ludorum trophy presented to the most successful Club on the day. This will be decided by a points system based on the finish position of each crew in their event.
- 13 All competitors must be members of British Rowing or another appropriate Governing Body. Crews racing must be as entered on BROE (but subs can be made in person to race control on the day). Random checks on whether crew members match information on BROE may be made on the day.
- 14 This Head will be run in accordance with British Rowing *Rules of Racing* and under the British Rowing *RowSafe* guidance.
- 15 All coxes must wear appropriate lifejackets or buoyancy aids. Marshals may inspect some or all boats and any not passing the standard safety requirements including buoyancy, bow balls and heel restraints will be turned back; please check boats before you come! Coxes will be weighed at TARC.
