Entries, fees and substitutions will only be accepted via BROE2. Seniors & Masters £8.00/seat, Juniors (racing as Juniors) £6.00/seat. Coxes free.

Close of entries and fee payment: 7.00pm on the Saturday before the event entered.

Close of online substitutions: 12 noon on the Friday before the event entered.

Telephone, email and postal entries or fees will not be accepted.

No provision for late entry or fees: no exceptions

Autumn Long Distance Sculling Series 2018

The NRC Autumn LDS Series 2018 comprises six Saturdays of racing spread over six consecutive weeks. The LDS events will generally be in the morning in a single division for all ages. They are for singles, doubles and guads only (plus octuples at Tyne).

At Tyne United, Tees, Wansbeck and Durham in the afternoon there is a second, independent head race run as an SBH which will have sweep (fours and pairs) as well as sculling - see host clubs' web sites for details. The four SBH results will not count towards the LDS series awards.

LDS ADDITIONAL LOCAL RULES.

- All categories in 1x, 2x, 4x-, 4x+, 8x+[Tyne only]; Open, Women's & Mixed in Junior, Senior and masters are offered. Note that Berwick will be limited to competitors J16 or older due to entry limits.
- Entries from participants very new to the sport, e.g. recent L2R course members, are encouraged. However, entries to be rowed in other than fine boats must draw attention to the fact on their entry.
- Clubs should ensure that all competitors have clothing adequate to both the conditions and the length of time to be spent on the water.
- Please be aware particularly on the large tidal rivers that conditions can be dangerous and can change very quickly. Ensure you and those you are responsible for are competent and able to deal with changes to the conditions prior to boating.
- Bow race numbers and paper numbers will be issued, one of each number per boat. All boats must have a bow-mounted slot to display the race number provided. No deposit will be required. However, the cost of replacement numbers will be reflected in future entry fees.
- Individual LDS prizes will be awarded, where 3 or more boats have started a class / category, as follows. Fastest 1x, 2x, 4x/x+, 8x+ (where applicable) in Junior, Senior, Masters; Open, Women and Mixed. Plus medals for J18/J17/J16/J15/J14/J13. The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate any categories they see fit to provide competition and to award prizes. Senior crews may be banded based on ranking points depending on number of entries.
- Where necessary Masters age entries will be grouped to allow prizes to be awarded based on the British Rowing handicap tables. The handicap tables will also be used to calculate the results of the Masters VL.
- All entries and payment of fees will be via BROE2 and will close at 7.00pm on the Saturday before the event entered.
- All substitutions should be made as far as possible on BROE2 by noon the day before the race. Any further substitutions must be reported on the day to race control. All substitutions must be reported before the start of racing and any crew racing with unreported substitutions is liable to disqualification.

- Event cancellations will be at the discretion of the Race Committee as soon as it is evident
 that the water is not rowable. This could therefore be during the days before or on the
 day of the race as circumstances dictate. However; every effort will be made to allow the
 race to run thus making late decisions likely.
- It is important that the Club contact number given with the entry is fully operational leading up to and on the day of the competition. So please avoid nominating someone who has either gone on holiday or is driving and therefore can't answer a call.
- In the event of a cancellation; a refund of 50% of the entry fee will be made.
- INSURANCE: Note that your BR membership insurance is only valid for UK residents who are resident in this country for more than six months in a year. Evidence of insurance cover must be provided by those not covered by BR membership insurance.
- All trophies and medals can be collected once the results have been published from race control or afterwards from Charly Curtis of the NRC.
- Numbers may have to be restricted if too many enter. Accepted entries will be at the sole
 discretion of the organising committee. We do advise you to enter early to avoid
 disappointment.

SERIES ADDITIONAL LOCAL RULES

- All finishing crews will score points for their Club in each Long Distance Sculling series head race. A simple points system will apply based on finishing position of each crew as follows:-
- A point will be awarded for every boat you have beaten by gender & boat class within your category. Categories will be grouped for this purpose as follows:
 - Seniors based on ranking points.
 - Juniors in three groups: J18/J17, J16/J15, J14/J13.
 - Masters will be grouped all together taking into account handicapped times.
 - Points gained by a crew will be split equally between crew members (coxes excepted) and allocated to the associated club.
 - Competitors must compete at 4 different LDS events for their points to count towards the series prize.
- Victores Ludorum will be awarded for the best Senior, Masters and Junior clubs.
- Victores Ludorum prizes will be presented at the Northern Rowing Council's Annual General Meeting in November but the results will be published as soon as possible following the last event.
